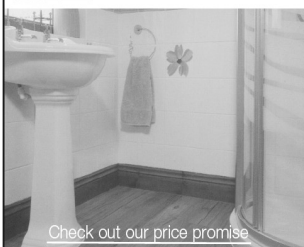

Charity begins at home

This is something most of us often hear said and it is very true. Charity does begin at home. It is in our homes we learn to share. It is within our families that we learn the pleasures of giving as well as receiving. For Christians it is in the Church (the Christian's second home), that we learn why Christians give. Christians give in response to God for all that he has given to us. So yes, charity does begin at home.

The problem is when people say this, they often mean it also stops there, using the phrase as an excuse for not giving to people they don't know or perhaps don't approve of.

Many of us will remember the old King James Version of the Bible (and some of us may lament its lack of use today!) which translated the word 'love as 'charity'. As a result we had readings of verses such as "faith, hope and charity abide; the greatest of these is charity."

The word charity was used to translate a particular New Testament Greek word: 'agape'. In the Bible this word is used to describe a specific type of love - God's special and unconditional love for his peo-

ple (as opposed to other various human expressions of love). A love that begins from within himself but by its very nature goes out to his creation.

We now associate charity with the task of giving to those in need, either directly or through charities. While we may all have different

ideas as to who the really needy are, we would probably all agree that the victims of the recent disasters in China and Burma are very much in need - especially in the case of Burma.

Although some would say "charity begins at home", once again the people of Britain have responded generously, both during Christian Aid Week and through the Disasters Emergency Committee fund.

Perhaps our nation's continuing response to

these world tragedies affirms the true meaning of the phrase "Charity begins at home"; it begins at home but doesn't end there - it flows out, like the love of God, to those most in need in our world.

In October 1958 the Revd Percy and Gaynor Smith bought Pilsdon Manor near Bridport in Dorset with the dream of building a community based on the principles of Little Gidding, a 17th century community in Huntingdonshire and the home of Nicholas Ferrar.

Percy and Gaynor's dream has come to much more than fruition. For 50 years the Pilsdon communities have been offering refuge to

people in crisis from all walks of life. Some are seeking a respite from the stresses of their everyday lives, others are working through depression, alcoholism, addiction, divorce or bereavement. Wayfarers and the homeless, seeking a rest on their journey are also welcome at our door. To all we offer friendship and hospitality as well as traditional Christian charity.

In 2004 the Benedictine Community at St Mary's Abbey invited the Revd Peter Barnett, then Warden of Pilsdon in Dorset,



to set up a similar community in former Ewell Community buildings. And so, in September 2004, the Pilsdon at Malling Community opened its doors.

Both Pilsdons aim to provide a therapeutic environment of communal living, manual work, recreation, creative opportunities, worship and pastoral care. People of any faith or none, and of any race or culture are made welcome.

Charity begins at home

Just ask the taxman

If you Gift-Aid your charity donations, you can claim a tax rebate as well. Here's how:

Using the Gift Aid scheme to make charitable donations can both benefit the charity you give to, and improve your own tax position. For those eligible, Gift Aid can increase the value of your charitable donation by allowing the recipient organisation to **reclaim the basic rate of tax on your contribution**. Higher rate taxpayers may then claim tax relief on the difference between the basic and higher rate of tax, thus allowing you to make the most of your charitable gift.

When you make a charitable donation, to include it in the Gift Aid scheme all you need to do is confirm to the charity that you are a UK taxpayer. This can be done over the phone, by signing a form, or by checking a statement on a website run by the charity. Once your declaration is received the charity can claim back an extra 28.2% of the amount you gave.

This means £22, representing the basic rate income tax you have already paid on your gross income of £100.

If you are a higher rate taxpayer paying income tax at 40%, **the charity can't claim back any further tax**, but you can. When you give £78 under the Gift Aid scheme you can claim an extra £18 in tax relief, which is 18% of your gross gift of £100.

If your income varies you may pay 40% tax in some tax years but not in others. This means your charitable gifts will only earn you extra tax relief when they are paid in a higher-earning year. However, you can now carry back Gift Aid donations that are made before you submit your self assessment tax return by completing box 15A.4 on the tax form, in respect of the tax year the return relates to.

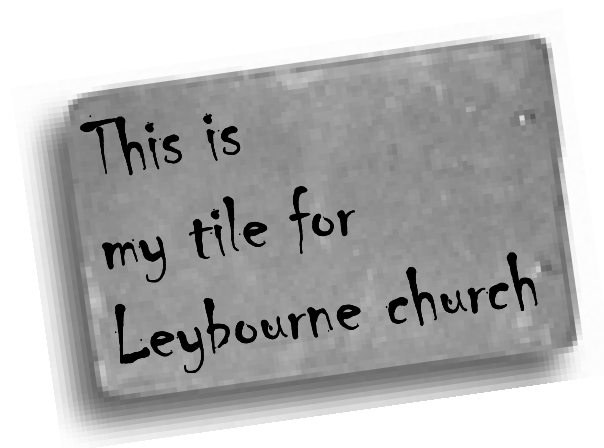

PRESENTATION BY JILL MUGGERIDGE,
KENT POLICE NEIGHBOURHOOD
WATCH LIAISON OFFICER

The aim of the NHW scheme is to bring communities together to get on top of crime. Aim is to ensure that the whole parish is covered by schemes. Co-ordinators required from each road to run the scheme. It is up to each co-ordinator how they operate within their road. Being a co-ordinator is not a major job just ensuring that messages received are passed to those who belong to the scheme.

Police reports: 3 crimes – all vehicle related:

- 1 – stolen car – Barleycorn
- 1 – tools stolen from car – Copseshill
- 1 – damaged car – Barleycorn

Baywell – looking at putting up a mobile camera to monitor anti-social behaviour, drinking etc.

Graffiti – all locations have been noted and photographs taken. Investigations into the 'tags' are being carried out.

Leybourne Football Club – the current facilities are appalling and need some attention. The changing rooms have been broken into. Action: parish council needs to create a wish list of facilities it wants to see at The Grange to go to the developers with. Need to ensure that facilities remain following development.

Rectory Lane South roadworks: Residents access will remain throughout any works.

MUGA drainage – area being surveyed and then some test bore holes will be sunk to see what can be done.

Toddlers Play Area – Big Lottery funding

earmarked for January – March 2009. This gives the parish council a year to get everything in place to ensure building starts at the earliest possible time. No response to date from public regarding formation of sub-committee to look at style, colour etc.

Recent power cuts were believed to have been caused by a fire on a high voltage transmission line. The EDF telephone number will be placed on website and in next newsletter.

Castle Way – 4x4 starting to park on footpath and block it. This is still classified as part of the cycle path. Action: Parish Council will ask resident not to park on path.

Broadband – everyone advised to ensure that their broadband connection is secure to prevent unauthorised use by people with laptops within the area.

Emergency services – no matter what time of day or night police vehicles and ambulances who use Castle Way are using their lights and sirens. Action: Clerk to write to West Kent Area Commander asking why.

Leybourne Grange Development – Due to the size of the development the Grange may have its own parish council. Government policy says that any development of a certain size can be self-governed. Community Development Trust will be responsible for managing the grounds etc, only land that will fall under parish/borough will be land with covenants that is leisure facilities and footpaths secured under section 106 agreements.

Bus shelter has been ordered and police written to asking to carry out speed traps along London Road.

Sub-committee to be formed to look at Toddler Play area.

Village Hall Committee: Flooring has

been agreed. Finance committee have approved subject to one query regarding wear being satisfactorily answered. Regular hirer's agreement form has been agreed – to be sent to councillors for ratification.

Storage facilities to be erected at side of village hall suggested in form of 2 x pre-treated metal garages – is planning permission required? Action: Councillors to come up with alternative proposals.

Parish Council Planning:
14 Rectory Lane South – Single storey rear extension and addition of 4 dormer roof extensions to create 6 bed chalet bungalow plus detached garage - Whilst the parish council has no objection to the proposals in that the ground area of the property is not increased, there is concern regarding the increase from a 3 bed to 6 bed property. Consideration needs to be taken by the planners to ensure that the comments of the neighbouring properties regarding the visual impact and any loss of privacy are taking into account. Consideration also needs to be given to parking arrangements. It is presumed that the

existing use, i.e. residential, is to remain. Chestnut Lodge, 75 Rectory Lane North – Gazebo (retrospective) The application is considered obtrusive to the neighbouring properties in that the usual height of a fence is 6ft as opposed to the proposed 8ft. We would request

therefore that the comments of the neighbouring properties, in particular those in Hayfield, are taken into account since they will be affected by the size and impact of the structure

Hydrant – SE Water have 2 alternative sites they are investigating. Should these be suitable the hydrant will be removed. Still some question over the permitted hours of usage. This needs to be clarified. Cover is missing. Need to advise SE Water that there is unrestricted use at present
 Action: Clerk to send TMBC list of breaches of use and write to SE Water re hydrant being open
 Footpath from school to Bridgewater

Place now seen as a health and safety issue since the poplar roots are lifting the path.

Skip at Pump Close has not been removed. No licence visible. Action: Clerk to report to TMBC licensing department

Litter pick scheduled for 3rd June. Areas in need of special attention to be identified.

Leybourne Scout Group re lack of suitable accommodation - The Grange development seems the ideal opportunity for the group with the possibility of tying facilities up with those for the football club. Message left with scouts to see if they have any ideas of a location. Scouts have been given time with the planners so can identify if anything is available on the site.
